

# **Residential Collection Quick Service Guide**



















### **CURBSIDE RECYCLING COLLECTION INCLUDES:**

**PLASTICS, METALS, & GLASS** - Rinse if possible, separate caps and lids and put in recycling bin.

**YES -** Glass bottles and jars. Aluminum cans, foil, tin cans and small metal items. All plastic containers. Milk and juice cartons and boxes. **NO -** Frosted glass, mirrors, plate glass, Pyrex, aerosol containers, or polystyrene (*Styrofoam*).

PAPER - Keep it clean and dry.

**YES -** All paper that tears. Cardboard packaging. Brown paper bags Plastic bags, bubble wrap, and air pillows.

NO - Contact with food. No pizza or donut boxes, paper plates, cups, napkins or tissue.

**CORRUGATED CARDBOARD** - *Please empty and flatten and place next to the curbside cart.* 

YES - Packaging tape okay. Remember to remove packaging material.

**NO -** Waxed cardboard or pizza boxes. Put them in your compostables cart.

**RECYCLE MORE!** Electronic items including televisions, computer monitors, printers, CDs, cell phones, wireless devices, and empty printer/toner cartridges can be brought to PSSI at: 339 Bonair Siding Rd. All clothing, shoes, books and scrap metal can be brought to the Recycling Drop Off Center at: 701 Serra St.











### **CURBSIDE COMPOSTABLES COLLECTION INCLUDES:**

**YES -** All food, food scraps, food-soiled paper (*pizza boxes, donut boxes, napkins*). Compostables plates (*Chinet and the very inexpensive paper plates ARE compostable, while plates with a petroleum/plastic liner ARE NOT*). Compostable plastics (*PLA,* 

*Bagasse*) that are certified as compostable by BPI. http://bpiworld.org. Grass clippings, flowers, leaves, weeds, brush, prunings, tree trimmings, and branches not more than 4 inches thick. All material must fit into the container with the lid closed.

**NO -** Palm fronds, garbage, sod, dirt, rock, concrete, ashes, human or animal waste, bathroom and facial tissue or recyclable materials.









### **BACKYARD GARBAGE COLLECTION INCLUDES:**

**YES -** Anything that is not recyclable or compostable.

**NO** - Recyclable materials, compostable materials, electronics, CFL lightbulbs, batteries or hazardous waste.

Landfilled garbage is collected once per week from where ever you store your garbage can(s) outside. The customer provides a 32 gallon can(s). Call our office to schedule pick up of additional cans.

# HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE



### **CURBSIDE COLLECTION**

Place on top of your curbside split recycling cart, clearly visible to our driver on your collection day.

- Household batteries Place in a clear 1-gallon zip-lock style plastic bag.
- Compact fluorescent lightbulbs (CFLs) Place in a clear 1-gallon zip-lock style plastic bag.



### **DROP-OFF SERVICE**

For Stanford Faculty and Staff residents only at the PSSI Office: 339 Bonair Siding Road, Stanford Campus

Hours: Monday - Friday 8am - 12pm and 1pm - 4pm.

- Customers must sign in to drop off materials at the office, and cannot drop off materials at the recycling center.
- There is no after-hours drop off.

## **ACCEPTED ITEMS**

- Latex Paint in original, non-leaking container with secure lid. (5-gallon limit per visit).
- Used Oil in a clearly marked 1-gallon plastic container with a screw top lid (2-gallons per visit).
- Used Oil Filters drained and placed in a clear 1 gallon zip-lock style plastic bag (2 per visit).
- Compact Fluorescent Lightbulbs (CFLs) in a clear 1-gallon zip-lock style plastic bag.
- Household Batteries in a clear 1-gallon zip-lock style plastic bag.
